"Sometimes you find out the most interesting things about someone, when you just sit down and ask a few simple questions."

Tom graduated from Los Altos High School. His class was the third class to graduate in a new school. He managed the swim and water polo teams, and acted in several plays. Tea House of the August Moon was his favorite. He attended Foothill Community College. He started work for Lockheed, and then joined the Naval Air Reserve in Alameda. Tom did two years active duty in the Philippines and worked on the newspaper, as well as being a disk jockey on the base radio station.

Tom worked for Lockheed from 1966-1998. "The culture changed. I took early retirement at 55."

Tom and his wife, Diane, have traveled extensively. They have gone through the Panama Canal, toured the Hawaiian islands, cruised on the Queen Elisabeth 2 along the East Coast to Nova Scotia, Quebec, and Montreal, as well as sailing around Australia and New Zealand.

Please join us on this train experience when we take Amtrak/BUS to Sacramento and the California Zephyr from Sacramento to Reno. We will make stops in Roseville, Colfax and Truckee, before arriving in Reno.

The higher up we will go in elevation, the more stunning and gorgeous the views will become. We will see bright, sunlit woodsy meadows, farmland, mountains, huge pine trees, Donner Lake and the Truckee River, which flows right beside us. We will travel through several dark tunnels. The views will change from bright green grass to snowy mountains, and the skies will go from sunshine to thick cloud cover. Gradually, we will start seeing patches of snow higher up and then maybe a foot or more of snow on either side of the train.
