Speaker for November is Daren Williams, and his father has the following history.

Holodomor 1932-33: Through the Eyes of Ukrainian Artists

While working to build U.S.-Ukraine business ties during the last 30 years of his life, Daren Williams' father, Morgan Williams, amassed the world's most extensive collection of artworks related to the Holodomor, or "forced starvation," Josef Stalin's Soviet regime killed an estimate 7-10 million Ukrainians to force them off their private land and onto collective farms. The Holodomor art collection serves as a timely and poignant reminder of the danger of letting one man gain absolute power. Daren will share the story of the Holodomor and his <u>father's work in Ukraine</u> through some of his favorite pieces in the collection, which his family has donated to the <u>National Museum of Holodomor-Genocide</u> in Kiev.
