And he influenced many important explorers, thinkers, and naturalists such as Charles Darwin, Henry David Thoreau and Ernst Haeckel.

All members found the book fascinating and rated it highly. The book was quite descriptive of Humboldt's efforts and a number of his adventures. The book was one the New York Times 10 best books of the year in 2015.

GOLF NEWS

McGrath and Gerich Win Club Championship

The 2022 Club Championship was played in fine weather from Oct. 24-31 at Baylands in Palo Alto. **Jim Thorne** fired an opening round 79 to get out to an early lead in the Low Gross category, followed by **Rich McGrath**, **Larry Low** and **Alan Pye**, each of whom shot 82. **Alan Pye's** 68 gave him the first-round lead in the Low Net event, and he was trailed by four players at 71: **Mack Asrat**, **John Gerich**, **Larry Low** and **John Rittweger**. Thorne did not play in the second round, and Rich McGrath (163) took the Low Gross lead with **Chris Weberg** (164) a shot behind. John Gerich (139) had a splendid second round, after which he held a two-stroke lead over Alan Pye (141) for Low Net. On the final day of the Championship McGrath and Gerich each built on their second-round leads to win their events. McGrath's 77 gave him a gross 240, 10 strokes ahead of Chris Weberg. Gerich also closed strongly. His net 67 gave him a 3-round total of 206, 7 strokes better than runner-up Alan Pye.

Garten Shoots 5 Under His Age

On November 3 at Poppy Ridge **Bob Garten** had the round of his life. Bob is 80 and shot a 75! Here's what he had to say about the round: "It's the first time shooting my age in a SIR event or ever. I had 13 pars, 1 birdie and 4 bogies. I didn't record putts. but hit most greens in regulation or chipped close to the hole for a one-putt on others. I had about 7 reasonable putts for birdies but only made one. Interestingly, the main thing I did for the round was swing at about 75% to make good ball contact. I played with **Jim Thorne** and for some reason I shoot well when he is in my cart." Branch 35 SIRs who shoot their age or better on a course rated at 66 or higher receive the "SIR Feather" trophy from State SIR as well as a \$200 cash prize from the Branch. Only the first time a member shoots his age in a calendar year is recognized in this way. Poppy Ridge's Course Rating from the gold tees is 66.0, so he will be receiving both forms of well-deserved recognition. Way to go, Bob!

Garten Shoots the Round of the Month

Bob Garten's great round at Poppy Ridge on Nov. 3 was the Round of the Month. His net 63 was 9.3 strokes "under".

Cioni Shoots his Age Again

Joe Cioni shot his age – 83 – on Nov. 21 at Baylands. The course is rated at 66.8 from the white tees. Congratulations, Joe!

News from the Annual Golf Committee Meeting

Joe Cioni shared this update from the Annual Meeting of the Golf Committee Nov. 11 at Baylands.

Highlights:

* **Les Miles** was elected Chairman effective Jan. 1.

* The prize for a hole-in-one remains at \$200.

* The prize for shooting one's age on a course rated 66.0 or more will be \$200 for the first such accomplishment and \$25 for a subsequent accomplishment, capped at \$25/year. These 5 golfers have already shot their age or better in 2022: **Cioni, Garten, McGrath, Mattson, and Jonekait**.

* The Inside Putter Length prize will be \$15, regardless of the amount of money in the fund.

* The prize for an eagle will be \$25.

* The tentative 2023 schedule was introduced. We are looking for Assistant Tournament Chairs. Please contact **Jay Jonekait**. We need more members to get involved.

* A group of scribes was formed to assist Tournament Chairs who are not familiar with Excel to complete tournament results.

* The fine for a cancellation within three days of a tournament, regardless of reason, was increased to \$10.

* The annual golf banquet will be held Friday February 3, 2023.

* Next year's club championship will be 3 rounds on the same course, the same as this year.

Till. Based on true events, the all too short life of Emmett Till is brought to the big screen in heart rendering detail. Emmett is a happy go lucky negro boy of 14 when he leaves Chicago to visit his uncle and cousins in 1955 Mississippi and runs into Jim Crow and virulent racism. After whistling at a young white woman clerk at a candy counter, Emmett is brutally beaten to death and his body tossed in the Tallahatchie River. This incident gave rise to the civil rights movement across the South and then the country. The film focuses on his mother, Mimi, and the brave actions she took to be sure the world knew what happened to her son and that he is not forgotten. Danielle Deadwyler as Mimi is sure to be nominated for an Oscar. Her grief is palpable. Her emotions are shattering. She figures out how to transform her grief into a powerful message that folks can rally round. The movie is Mimi's story as a strong mother who will see that justice is done. Rated PG-13 for thematic content involving racism, strong disturbing images, and racial slurs. The movie is tough to watch but is a must see. In Theatres. It is a Peggy's pick.

Bad Sisters. This is a delightful look at sisterhood, misogyny, justifiable homicide, revenge, and insurance fraud. All of this is wrapped in considerable Irish charm and wit. The five Garvey sisters lost their parents some years back. The sisters have a special bond to protect one another. Eva, Ursula, Becka, and Bibi share an intense hatred for JP, the husband of their sister, Grace. JP sets new standards for heinous behavior. Grace is blind to his odious perversions. His sisters-in-law form a pact to murder him and free Grace. Their schemes go awry in all sorts of humorous ways. We know JP is dead, but the how and who did the deed is left for our imagination as the story deliciously unwinds over 10 episodes. The sisters are also tested by an intrepid insurance claim investigator who is looking for evidence of murder by sister, so JP's life insurance won't have to pay. The performances by the Irish sisters are remarkable. JP is played by a Danish actor who perfectly portrays the ultimate slime ball. Rated TV MA for language. This series is a must see and available on Apple TV+. It is a Peggy's Pick.
