Not much fishing this month. A big trip, like our trip to Eagle Lake October 16<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> leaves many of our fishermen with repairs to be made. Virtually every one of our boat owners had minor to major repairs to make. And, so, fishing has had to wait. Notwithstanding, much credit is due to Branch 8's **Richard Bal** for his wonderful arrangements on the Eagle Lake trip. Richard thought of everything and his forethought made it a slick trip for all.

The only beneficiaries are the salmon and stripers, which are slipping past us into the Delta and up the Sacramento and San Joaquin Rivers. Reports are legion of huge striper catches and our guys haven't been able to do any of the catching. Aside from relief from the normal "honey-do-chores", a few days out on the water can do wonders for the attitude of anyone of our members who can get out. For this purpose we've set up a roster of those "who gotta fish" (21 at this writing) with the idea in mind that those, who decide to "go" can readily find a buddy to accompany them. We expect to see more and more guys doing this as the season winds down.

Branch 146's **Sal Costanza** reported at our regular fishing breakfast on the results of three of his own "gotta fish" expeditions. Several great eating 5-9 pounders were caught near the old Port Chicago Docks, and, for a bonus, he was able to launch at the Martinez Marina (just a short boat ride away from the fishing grounds). Sure beats the 6-7 hour ride up to Eagle Lake. Branch 128's **Jack Helbert** reported also on results of a 9 passenger "Combo trip" out of Emeryville and out the Gate for salmon and crab. They limited on salmon (2 fish per pole) and he netted 6 Dungeness Crabs for the pot as a bonus. Great trip and they were home early. (He didn't say that, when they went out, they left the pier at 5:30 a.m. in the dark). Fishing isn't for sissies.

As far as further events for this year, the Group expects to have, at least, one more trip to Oregon for steelhead - date uncertain - depends upon the water flow in the rivers. Then, we'll go into next year's events, which will start with group trips to the Sacramento, San Mateo and/or Pleasanton Boat and OutDoor shows. Always interesting (sometimes members come home with "stuff" they never expected to buy) and all part of the fun.


