The seminar featured 6 onehour presentations by people who fish most of the year in that locale. In addition to the "best tips" those speaking showed off the latest and best in equipment for the 2006 season. The hot new lures are always on the "to purchase" list, and **Craig Walton** came home with a new custom rod for his collection. Great day, and even the polish dogs for lunch were top notch.

On October 6th **Ed Dijkman** and **Joe Maurino** went out of the Gate on the "Dandy"(a "six pack") for salmon and tried to repeat the successes of past trips. The day before and the day after everyone had limits, but this day netted only 2 fish for the whole Emeryville fleet (that is 7 boats). Wow!!!! Expensive lesson, but you have to understand the name of the game is "fishing" not "catching".

Since the Haps Seminar, **Craig Walton** and others of our Area 2 members have been making day trips to the Delta for salmon and stripers. The first of these was a great boat ride. But, on October 7th **Craig** hit two nice salmon (a 17# and 19#) and a further salmon was also taken. Lots of fresh fish in the freezer.

The big trip for the month was, of course, to Eagle Lake. Sixteen of our Area 2 Fishermen went on this trip. On October 17 we went for a week to Spaulding on the West shore of the Lake. The weather was really cold in the morning but warmed up during the day. The food was great as prepared by each of our homegrown chefs to suit the most sensitive palate. Stories were, as usual, lots of fun. The fishing is always good, given the size of the fish we are after, 2-4 pounds is the norm. Many stories to tell, including Bill Hoov's boat that started to sink at the dock; about Ed **Dijkman** being the king of the "untangles" (starts with a set of tangled lines and slowly and methodically winds them apart without cuts, etc, a miracle); and "Hot pants" Paul DuBow, who accidentally burned a 10 inch hole in the leg of his pants while fishing on the guide boat but continued to fish even with a 2nd degree burn on his leg. Despite these
