No explanations were given as to why membership is declining statewide.

The rest of us caught a few fish and helped Craig with potential limit problems by eating 6. We also explored Lake Valley and Spaulding Reservoirs (off highway 80 near Emigrant Gap). Beautiful lakes, but not very productive (caught only a couple of catfish). In all, the trip was a great success, capped by a great Italian dinner in Nevada City.

Five of our members went up to New Melones reservoir (near Angel's Camp) for 4 days of Kokanee fishing between August 7 to 12. The weather was really hot (102 degrees plus) and the fish were really deep (85 to 90,). Here again, **Craig Walton** was the star; boating 7 of the 20 fish (biggest 18") caught on this foray.
