Area 2 Fishing Report

The fishing is getting hot!!!! Our trip to Davis Lake north of Truckee and near Portola (October 1 to 4) produced lots of fish. Fishmaster was Branch 8's Joe Karg and those going included Craig Walton (Branch 8), Terry Miller (Branch 116 - the Big Fish), Paul Dubow (Branch 116) and Don Mittelstaedt (Branch 34) and a friend, **Ted Morrison**. The fishermen stayed at a resort at the Lake. Though they had drizzle and fog in the morning, the days cleared to beautiful sunshine by mid-day. The fish cooperated fully, all fishermen having limited out by early afternoon. Don and Ted, who used float tubes, caught and released some 46 fish for their part. Craig Walton even caught a Northern Pike. A great trip, but, alas, may be the only one possible for a couple of years, as the Fish and Game people intend to poison the lake in August of 2007 to rid it of the Pike. Though they intend to restock, it should take a couple of years to get the fishery back up to speed.

On September, Branch 8's **Bob Kahl** and **Joe Maurino** went to Bridgeport (Eastern Sierra on the California-Nevada border) for fly-fishing. They fished the East and West Walker Rivers and some spring creeks. Limits every day. Great trip.

Dick Thomson (Branch 116) reported on trips out the gate for salmon (wound up getting rock fish), at the Mothball fleet (for stripers) only nice ride, and to Lake Tahoe for lake trout. At the later, he managed to catch 5 Mackinaws in the 3+# range. The latter were on his birthday; what a present!!!

Harry Sherinian (Branch 116) reported on a trip to the Upper Sac (fly fishing, catch and release) wherein he caught a 10# rainbow. He was fishing off a pontoon boat. Catch and release, so we have to take his word for it.

Craig Walton and Joe Peterson (Branch 19) officiated at the Rio Vista Bass Derby over the weekend of October 14-15. They were weigh masters. They reported on a 39# striper and a 36# salmon, which went over the scales. The Bass Derby was won by a target fish caught closest to

the pre-selected hour and at the pre-selected weight (there were 6 caught to meet the measurements but tiebreakers were weight and time). Prize was \$2,000, so worth the effort.

Sal Costanza (Branch 146) reported on fishing at Ryer Island (in the Delta opposite Pittsburg) on October 19th. They still-fished and trolled and caught some 6# stripers, which were keepers and prime eating. They caught them on light trout gear, and had lots of fun bringing them in.

Our big trip to Eagle Lake is coming up on Sunday, October 22. We will be there through Friday, October 27. **Craig Walton** is Fishmaster (taking 11 fishermen) and has everything all lined up. Cabins are at Spalding on the west side of the Lake and we have lots of boats. J Fair, a local guide, will be there on Sunday night to give a run-down on the best spots to fish. More about this later.

- day trips to Delta for stripers/salmon (as arranged with boat owners over the balance of October and into November);
- day trips out the Golden Gate for salmon (dates open depending upon the fishing, Ed Diikman is Fishmaster);
- trip to Oregon for salmon (date is open, depending on fishing, Ed Dijkman is Fishmaster); and
- trip to Klamath for steelhead (dates are open, **John Wall** is Fishmaster).

There is much more to come, so, if you're not fishing, you're not trying.

November Guest Speaker

ROBERT (BOB) THARRATT

The subject of Bob's presentation will be "My Experiences as Prisoner of the Germans during World War II". His appearance this month is particularly timely with this months' observance

of Veterans Day.

Born May 17, 1923 in Hull England, Bob moved to Canada in 1928, and to the U.S. in Octber1930. He graduated from Canoga Park High School in October 1942, and joined the U.S. Army Air Force in January 1943.

His training with the Air Force included Basic Training, Aircraft Mechanic Training, and Aerial Gunnery Training. In December 1943, his Combat Crew Assignment was Ball Turret Gunner, and he received his Combat Crew Training in Ardmore, Oklahoma from January thru April 1944.

Bob was assigned to the 8th Army Air Force, 96th Bomb Group, 338th Squadron, based in Snetterton Heath, England in May 1944. On his 5th mission (June 25, 1944) he was wounded over France,

and on his 18th mission (September 10, 1944) shot down over Nuremburg, Germany.

Bob was interred as a Prisoner of War at Stalag Luft IV in Kiefthelde, Germany. He experienced a forced 600 mile march from February 6, 1945 to April 26, 1945. Liberated on April 26, 1945 he was sent to Hospital Halle, in Germany, and returned to the U.S., Hampton Roads, Virginia, in June 1945. Bob was discharged in Santa Ana, California on October 29, 1945, with the rank of Tech/Sgt.

Bob attended UC Davis from January 1946 to October 1949, and was Manager of Farmer's Feed & Supply, Walnut Creek, from 1949 until 1961. He worked as a sales rep for Pacific Cement & Aggregates and Lone Star Industries from 1961 to 1987, and retired in 1988.

Bob is married to Jeane and has four children and eight grandchildren. He has lived in the Walnut Creek area since 1949 and is currently a resident of Rossmoor.

On November 11 (Veterans Day) 2000, Bob received The Distinguished Flying Cross.
