All SIR members and guests are welcome to participate in fishing trips as well as attend the monthly meetings. The next meeting will be October 18th, at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. Meeting starts at 8:30 am.

Since the last newsletter, SIR fishermen were busy. Jack Waddell made a trip to Los Vaqueros for 2 trout and a 10 lb striper. Dick Thomson made several unsuccessful trips for salmon, but getting some nice ling and rock cod when the boat changed methods. Others trying for salmon were Craig Walton, Jack Helbert, Harry Sherinian, and Joe Karg. This has been a sadly unproductive year for salmon. Some members changed their focus to fishing the bay for halibut. Dick Thomson, Joe Peterson, and Craig Walton made 3 trips scoring several small keeper halibut each trip, with a 10 ponder topping the list. John Hayes and Carl Moyer were less successful, getting only shakers on their trolling attempt. Dick and the gang trolled on one trip, and drifted live anchovies on the other two outings.

An event surpassing everyone's imagining happened when **Joe Karg** caught a keeper 48 inch sturgeon fishing with **Carl**



Moyer. Joe is a legend for unsuccessful sturgeon tries, having spent over 200 hours trying without a keeper. Joe used his new found luck to catch 2 nice ling cod, and a nice cabezone fishing on the ocean with Carl. **Joe Peterson** caught that one magic day when the wind wasn't blowing in the delta to catch several keeper stripers. Joe also fished with Carl Moyer on the ocean for limits of very nice rockfish. Craig Walton fished the delta

very successfully, catch-

ing and releasing a lovely 34 inch striper while trolling. **Dick Thomson** caught 5 mackinaw trout in Lake Tahoe. **Carl**

Moyer had a great day fishing for albacore tuna. The 5 man crew landed 23 albacore to 25 lbs., and could have caught more, but stopped when both fish boxes were full. Carl made a very bouncy trip to Duxbury reef for salmon to no avail, but has been very pleased with 5 other trips on the ocean for rockfish, ling cod, and cabezone. Bill Hooy and Carl trolled and bait fished the delta for a great many small stripers and no keepers. Several members who planned trips for trout in the mountains cancelled their plans due to low water.

The salmon season with few exceptions is very poor. The size limit is 20 inches, limit of 2 fish, and no silver salmon may be kept. Silvers have white upper gums, and there are a lot of them this year. Halibut in the bay is a bit better with 5 undersized caught for every keeper, and keepers coming a bit more often. In general, this year has been a poor year for us fisherman, with low water inland, big winds locally, and high angry water on the ocean.

Upcoming events are: **Craig Walton** leading a trip to Lake Almanor October 21 - 25; various ocean salmon outings, **Dick Thomson**, fishmaster; and a striper/salmon trip to the delta, **Terry Miller** fishmaster.
