Currently our membership is at 250 compared to a maximum membership of 260. At its April meeting the Executive Committee will be discussing possible ways to encourage new members to join our branch. Let us know your thoughts and suggestions on this subject. Of course the most effective approach continues to be for each of us to invite retired friends, co-workers, and neighbors, etc. to attend our branch activities and luncheons.

He closed with the same sobering reflection on Islamic terrorists offered in a previous book group selection, *Charlie Wilson's War:* that we will not have peace with Islamic extremists until they do not live in poverty and until they feel respected.
