

Luncheon Speaker By Little Sir Frank Crua



Our speaker for the July luncheon is John Roebuck. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1941 with a degree in Chemical Engineering. He



accepted employment with Standard of California who is now known as Chevron. He quickly got into the design of plants for the production of aviation gasoline, and ingredients for synthetic rubber, both desperately needed in the World War II effort.

After a few years in the develop-

ment and production of chemicals, he was transferred to Caltex, Chevron's overseas affiliate with Texaco, where initially he performed investment analyses, petroleum product forecasting, and general management. He was made Marketing Manager of the Caltex Danish Co.

He then returned to refining and negotiated a joint interest refinery in Singapore and served as the Director for several years, before completing his professional work as Director of Manufacturing in the Philippines.

The title of John's presentation is Future Energy. He will speak about the oil crunch, alternative fuels, and other ways of obtaining the energy necessary to meet global demands.

Our next LADIES DAY event is scheduled for Thursday, October 23rd. Mark your calendar.





Stewardship of the Nation

The group assembled at 10:15 AM on Monday, June 2 at Orinda Books to discuss *Vanishing America* by James Conaway. This was actually the May meeting although we met in June. 



Following early retirement in January, 1982 Bob worked as a Consultant in Career Development before retiring a second time in 1994.

In, 1963, after 6 years with Phillips Petroleum in Bartlesville he left Phillips to accept the position of Director of Industrial Relations with Standard Magnesium and Chemical in Tulsa. Bob says that he wanted to be with a smaller company in order to to have broader responsibilities. So one year later the company was acquired by Kaiser Aluminum.


