First place went to Dick Chaffee / Gene Gould with 44.5 points out of a possible 72, or 61.81 %. Second place was a tie with 42.50 points between Lou Sandor / Lytton DeSilva and Jim Nachtweih / Bob Wolf. Forth place went to Floyd Skelton / Dan Greenberg. On April 8, 25 men had lunch and a bridge session at Roundhill C.C. Bill Sullivan was high scorer with 6,320 points, followed by Monte Hall (6,090), Jai Yee (5,200) and Art Donaldson (5,030). We had four small slams today, Bill Sullivan / Ken Harold, Lytton DeSilva / Ken Harold, Jack Butler / Bob Wolf and Ali Aghaiepour / Lytton DeSilva.

On April 22, 28 men gathered for lunch and bridge at Diablo C.C. This was the lowest scoring day so far this year. High man was Dick Chaffee with 5,390 points. Second was Norm Schoenfeld with 5,130 points, third was Ron Wolberg with 4,580 and a tie for forth at 4,320 between Jack Butler and Jim Nachtweih. Only two small slams today, Fred Massaro / Bob Wolf and Norm Schoenfeld / Ron Wolberg.

On April 29, we held a Ladies Day lunch and bridge event, with 20 couples attending. After an excellent lunch, we sat down to 3 hours of enjoyable social bridge. Our winners were:

Richard & Donna Madden (4,520), Monte & Helene Hall (4,040), Rich Black & Donna Argenbright (4,000), Dave & Claire Rasmussen (3,940) and Milt & Marge Greenstein (3,550). As the numbers show, this was a low scoring day. Only 2 small slams were bid and made, one by the Maddens and one by the Greensteins. But everyone said they had a great afternoon and looking forward to the next time.

He was 90 in April leading to the Senior SIR designation.
Mac joined Branch 116 in 1984 during the term of the first Big SIR, Norm Frantz. He served as Christmas party committee chairman in 1990 and Branch treasurer

in 1992. He was active in the golf group for several years until sidelined by a shoulder injury. Mac was born in Lyons, Nebraska in 1918. He received a Bachelors degree from the University of Iowa in 1940 and an MBA degree from Harvard University in 1943.

He was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. in November 1943 and served 31/2 years in World War II including two years in New Guinea and Australia. He was discharged with a rank of Captain in 1946. Mac married Betty Ann in April 1948. They have two daughters and one grandson.

Mac worked in commercial banking most of his career. He was with Security First National Bank for several years in their Los Angeles Headquarters and later as a branch manager in Santa Barbara. He joined Wells Fargo Bank in San Francisco in 1970 in the Loan and Credit Review Dept. He retired from Wells Fargo in 1980.


