# Remember The 1st Three Letters - S.T.R

#### STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke... totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours. which is tough.

#### RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Thank God for the sense to remember the '3' steps. STR Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke arc difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

 $\underline{S}$  – Ask the individual to SMILE.  $\underline{T}$  – Ask the person to TALK and

SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE

(Coherently)

(i.e. It is sunny out today)

<u>R</u> – Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with any one of these tasks, call 911 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

## New Sign of a Stroke

Stick out Your Tongue

NOTE: Another sign of a stroke is this: Ask the person to stick out his tongue.. If the tongue is crooked, if it goes to one side or the other, that is also an indication of a stroke.

The SIRS Book Group met at 10:15 AM on Monday August 25 at Orinda Books to discuss "The Devil in White City" by Eric Larson.

Joining the group were Jack Butler, Bob Daily, Lytton DeSilva, John Fraser, Al Reynolds (who suggested the book and led the discussion in Rich's absence), Jim Scott, Tim Tinnes, and Joel White.

There was a very spirited discussion of the book's juxtaposition of the creation and building of the 1892 Chicago world's fair by architect Daniel H. Burnham and H.H. Holmes, a "physician" and serial killer in Chicago at the same time. Most agreed the book an enjoyable read and presented many of the innovations that occurred for the fair, such as Shredded Wheat, Aunt Jemima, the Ferris Wheel, and many more. Also the historical significance the fair played in commencing the spread of electrification and the strengthening of labor unions. While fascinating, it seemed we all questioned the rationale for intermingling the two stories. Other than their temporal concurrence, the story of HH Holmes was mostly conjecture gathered from newspaper articles and court records, while the other was history, and neither story contributed to the other.

The group will discuss "Collapse" by Jared Diamond on Monday, September 22 at 10:15 in the morning at Orinda Books. Hope to see you there. The October selection is "The Truth about Muhammad--Founder of the World's Most Intolerant Religion" by Robert Spencer.
