"Public Relations - New Challenges, Proven Strategies"

Bob Irelan began his career as a journalist and then spent more than 30 years in corporate public relations.

He served as vice president, public relations, for Kaiser Aluminum & Chemical Corporation for 12 years -- from 1985 to 1997. He also served as vice president, public relations, for MAXXAM Inc. and its subsidiaries from 1990 to 1999. (MAXXAM acquired Kaiser in 1988 and also owned companies involved in forest products, real estate, resort development, and horse racing.)

During his Kaiser tenure, Bob served for nine years (1970-79) as executive assistant to Edgar Kaiser, who was chairman of the various Kaiser industrial companies and the Kaiser Foundation Health Plan.

Since retiring, he has stayed active in the public relations profession by teaching and consulting. For the past five years, Bob taught an "Essentials of Public Relations" course at the University of California, Davis, Extension. Prior to that, for two ars, he taught a "Writing for Public Relations" course at University of the Pacific.

Before joining the Kaiser organization in 1968, Bob




