Contra Costa Water District- Update on Water Supply Conditions

Our speaker for July is Joe Campbell. Joe was elected to the Contra Costa Water District's Board of Directors in 1991, representing eastern Concord, Clayton, and part of Walnut Creek. He is the current Board President and has served in that capacity for more than 13 years.

Joe operated a professional engineering construction firm for 23 years until it was sold in 1989. He is currently an independent businessman. In 1988 he served as co-chairman and key fund-raiser for the successful campaign to approve bonds for the District's \$450 million Los Vaqueros Reservoir Project. He also was a member of the steering committee for the statewide campaign against the Peripheral Canal in 1982.

Until his election to the Contra Costa Water District Board, Joe served as Chairman of the County Airport Land Use Commission, which regulates development that could affect air traffic safety at the County airports in Concord and Byron. He is a former Vice President of the Concord Chamber of Commerce, and served as a member of the Concord General Plan Committee and the Founder Advisory Board of Concord Commercial Bank. He is on the Board of Directors of the Contra Costa Council and a member of the Concord Rotary. He is a former member of the Walnut Creek Child Care Task Force, former parade chairman for the Walnut Festival Association, former board member of the Northgate High School Boosters, and a former board member for the American Red Cross. Joe is past president and a founder of the Concord Economic Development Corporation which is a partnership of the Concord Chamber of Commerce and the City of Concord.


