All SIR members and guests are welcome and, indeed, encouraged to participate in fishing trips as well as attend the monthly meetings. Next meeting will be Thursday, December17th, at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. Meeting starts at 8:30. Our speaker will be Clyde Wands sharing his experience with smallmouth bass fishing.

Craig Walton and Jim Andrews fished Lake Davis with flies with excellent results. Unbelievable is the correct term for the sturgeon fishing Carl Moyer has enjoyed. He and Dick Thomson caught 25 sturgeon including 2 keeper size, released, in two forays. Terry Miller and Carl caught an unbelievable 35 sturgeon with 3 keepers, 2 released and a 54 incher killed in two trips. Bob Olson and Carl caught 20 sturgeon including a 61 inch keeper, killed. Paul Corbitt and Carl caught 18 sturgeon including an 83 inch, 185 lb monster, released. Joe Karg and Carl caught 12 sturgeon. And Paul Dubow picked the windy day, and after only 2 hours, the windblown duo fled the white -capped froth with no fish caught. However, a week later, Paul Dubow and Carl caught 8 trout at Shadow Cliffs Reservoir, 4 of which were very nice 1 ¹/₂ to 3 1/2 lb fish. Sal Costasnza caught 4 nice Striped Bass fishing anchovies near Grizzly Island; and caught 4 more a week later at the Little Cut.

We will be very busy this winter with: delta fishing for striped bass and sturgeon, trout fishing in our local lakes, and party boat trips for sturgeon, stripers, and crab/fish combination. These outings will include those who rarely fish but would like to try. If you haven't been fishing in a while, but might like to test drive an adventure, come on down to our next meeting..

"Dine-O-Sirs" Dinner Group Ben Smith





Nine Hole Info Dick Chaffee, 9-Hole Chairman



SIR 116 9-Hole Golf Club membership is open to all Branch members and guests regardless of your golfing ability. We play every Wednesday starting at 10:00am. We rotate playing Buchanan Fields, Concord, Pine Meadows, Martinez and Diablo Hills, Walnut Creek.

The 9 Hole Golf Club is organized into a single flight. The weekly Champion is the player with the lowest net score. The weekly Champion is awarded 3 points, 2nd place 2 and 3rd place 1. The 2009 Champion will be the golfer with the highest point total.

In December, we will again hold our 9 Hole Golf Championship Tournament. The Tournament will be 3 rounds of golf. One round at each of the courses we play.
