

Joe Peterson and Carl fished the same area a week later with a dismal result. Joe later teamed with Craig Walton to catch 3 keepable stripers, many smaller ones, and a baby sturgeon. Craig Walton, Tom Boltz, George Shultze, Al Brunner, Terry Miller, Joe Miscione, and Romano Gnusti braved the wind and rain at Lake Almanor, catching only a few nice rainbows in the storm. 
