This Month's Luncheon Speaker

"100 years in Shanghai, 1850-1950"

Matook "Mat" Nissim was born in Shanghai, China in 1923. His family originated in Baghdad in the early 1800's and migrated to India with the Sassoon Banking Empire. His grandfather was born in Alahabad, India and his grandmother was born in Shanghai, China. Mat was raised and educated in Shanghai and lived through the 1932 and 1937 Sino-Japanese Wars.

After the Boxer Rebellion, he witnessed the influx of Russian Jews escaping from the pogroms of the Tsarist regimes and later the arrival of Eastern Europeans that were able to flee the Hitler persecution in 1939-1941.

Mat together with his family and other British nationals were interned by the Japanese in Yangchow, China during World War Two. After the war he was forced to leave China and embarked on a




