SLOW PLAY

I have had several complaints about slow play in our tournaments. Some causes of slow play that have been observed by myself and others (at least some of which I am also guilty) are:

- (1) Excessive time spent getting ready to hit your shot: a. select your club while waiting your turn to hit, b. no-one needs more than a couple of practice swings one is better, c. After you hit your shot, clear the area quickly, d. if you are in a cart drive directly to your ball or split the difference with your cart partner.
- (2) Excessive time looking for lost balls: a. have your playing partners watch your shot to mark where it lands, b. if there is a chance you are O.B. or have a lost ball, hit a provisional ball, c. Often it is obvious your ball is not going to be found or is hopelessly O.B. don't waste time looking for it, d. I think the USGA says don't spend more than five minutes looking but it would be better if we spent less, captains should keep track of the time and call a halt to the search.
- (3) Common sense things: a. when you are close to or on the green take cart or your clubs to the forward part of the green and come back to play your ball don't leave your clubs short of the green and then have to go back after them when you have putted out, b. If you are maxed out, pick up. That's why we have maxes, c. If we are playing cart path only take all the clubs you might need to your ball, d. If you are a full hole behind and unable to pick up the pace, let the group behind you play through. e. Don't just stand around, do something to help speed up the round.

Probably the biggest contribution we can make individually is to be aware of the things that we, ourselves, do in (1), (2) and (3) above that contribute to slow play and make a conscious effort to correct them.

- Never keep more than 300 separate thoughts in your mind during your swing.
- When your shot has to carry over a water hazard, you can either hit one more club or two more balls.
