Both Bob and Don spent a few days watching the wind make whitecaps on the Lake, which is located in Nevada north of Reno. Craig Walton, Jim Andrews, Dick Thomson, and Carl Moyer all took a maiden voyage to the Trout Pond at Lake Commanche in their float tubes, fishing with flies. You can easily add music and titles. Phil says the program is available for Vista and Win 7, not XP. Win XP has Windows Movie Maker which is somewhat limited. You must download a copy for Vista or Win 7 along with some other useful utilities from the Microsoft website.

Then Phil will show how to print ink on a DVD for a label. No one should print sticky labels for DVD's; they are unreliable and cause the DVD player to stop working.

Finally, Dick Kaufmann will show his photo books that he makes on the computer. They are quite beautiful.
