

David C. (Dave) Reeves Chevron Corporation

Our speaker this month will be Mr. Dave Reeves who will be speaking to us about the "GENERAL WORLD OF OIL".

Dave Reeves is president of Global Supply and Trading for Chevron Corporation – a position he assumed in May 2006. He is responsible for leading the corporation's worldwide supply and trading operations, as well as its aviation and marine fuels businesses.

A native of Erie, Pennsylvania, Dave graduated from the University of Washington in 1978, after earning a bachelor's degree in civil engineering. He joined Chevron the same year as an associate engineer in the company's marketing department, based in San Francisco, and progressed through various positions of increasing responsibility. At the time of the merger between Chevron and Texaco and until 2003, Dave served as president of North America Products for Chevron. In this capacity, he was responsible for refining and product marketing activities, pipeline transportation and energy management solutions within North America and for Chevron's global aviation fuels marketing.

From 2003 to 2006, he was managing director and chief executive officer of Caltex Australia Ltd., the largest refining and marketing company in Australia. Caltex Australia Ltd., in which Chevron holds a 50 percent interest, is a public company listed on the Australian Stock Exchange.

Dave is a past chairman of the Western States Petroleum Association and the Australian Institute of Petroleum. He previously served as a board member of the California Chamber of Commerce in Australia and currently chairs the Downstream Committee of the American Petroleum Institute.


He was born in May 1955.

The Branch 116 Duplicate Bridge Group met on Tuesday, December 1st at the Pleasant Hill Bridge Center with 18 players attending. The winning team today was Jack Butler / Marty Seaman with a 65.28 % score (47.00 out of a possible 72 points). In second place was the team of Bill Sullivan / Bob Daily with 59.03 %. Third place was captured by Marv DeHeus / Tony Pimentel, and in fourth place was Dick Chaffee / Joel White with 50.69 %. These four teams earned ACBL black master points.

Luncheon Bridge

On December 8th, the Lunch / Bridge Group met at Round Hill C.C. with 22 men attending. Our top scorer today was Oscar Krikorian with 6,810 points, and in second place was Gene Gould with 5,730 points. Third place was won by Jai Yee (5,660) followed by Fred Massaro (5,300) and Lou Sandor (5,150). Three small slams were made today by the teams of Bill Sullivan / Oscar Krikorian, Jack Butler / Lou Sandor and Jai Yee / Dennis Perry. This was one of our highest scoring average day this year with an average score of 4,077 points.

On December 22nd, 20 men gathered at Diablo C.C. for lunch and bridge. Our top scorer today was Art Donaldson (6,770) followed by Jack Butler (6,450), Bob Daily (5,420), Fred Massaro (5,020) and Ken Harold (4,470). Small slams were made by Art Donaldson / Bob Kahl, Ali Aghaiepour / Marv DeHeus and Fred Massaro / Walt Kawecki.

2009 Review

During 2009, we had an average attendance of 23.5 men per session, with four men who attended all



24 bridge sessions. For the year, our average high scorer was Ali Aghaiepour with a 4,399 point average (with at least 15 sessions attended). In second place was Gene Gould with an average score of 4,367, followed by Ron Wohlberg with 4,181 points. During the year , we had 5 grand slams and 63 small slams bid and made. 2009 was a good year for the bridge group, and we are looking forward to an even better year in 2010.
