## DUTIES OF OUR GOLF CAPTAINS:

Most of us are familiar with those Captain's duties that have to do with contacting the members of our team, keeping score, gathering scorecards and handing them off to the next captain. An often overlooked duty of our Captains is to keep the pace of play so that his group keeps up with the group in front. It isn't sufficient to just keep ahead of the group behind us. It is easy to tell when your group is falling behind. Some things that can be done to promote good pace of play are (1) limit time spent looking for balls, (2) having everyone watch to locate errant shots, (3) have players choose a club or clubs before they approach their ball, (4) have drivers of carts split the difference between balls instead of going from one to the other (5) playing "ready golf" we don't play "honors" on the tee and (6) just saying, "we're falling behind. Let's pick up the pace."
