

SIR Fishing Group Harry Sherinian



The duplicate bridge group met on July 5th at the Diablo Valley Bridge Center, with 20 men attending. Our top scorer with 60.92 points were Bill Sullivan/Howard Brandis. In second place with 56.30 points were Bob Wolf/Oscar Krikorian, followed by Conrad Robertson/Norm Schoenfeld (55.92), Lou Sandor/Lytton DeSilva (52.93) and Jim Nachtweih/Tony Pimintel (47.67).
