Luncheon Speaker By Little Sir Neil Schmidt

Repairing the Hubble Space Telescope & Building It's Replacement - The James Webb Space Telescope

Ever wonder how the Hubble space telescope was launched into orbit without checking to see if the view was clear and how it was fixed in orbit after it was discovered? My presentation will reveal the engineering mistakes that eventually resulted in this billion dollar failure and my involvement in designing the "eyeglasses" for Hubble that resulted in the spectacular images we now have from this marvelous instrument. The end of useful life of the Hubble space telescope is coming to an end very soon and NASA is building a replacement telescope - the James Webb Space Telescope (JWST). I have been involved in the fabrication of this observatory for the last seven years and we will explore how the telescope is manufactured and the operation of this new telescope when it is in orbit.

Tracy Peters is employed by Tinsley Laboratories and has been involved in the creation of most of the optical systems for orbiting observatories, among the most important was the repair optics for the Hubble and his current project, the James Webb Space Telescope.


