Craig Walton and Harry Sherinian tried Lake Berryessa on a tip of a hot salmon bite. They got only Kokanee, to 20 inches. Paul Dubow did part day trips in Alaska for small salmon, all released. And the strong winds followed Kent Cremolini all the way to Mexico, forcing them to fish closer in than they wanted. So no yellowfin tuna were caught, but the yellowtail were very cooperative, and large, and they returned with a good catch.

We will be very busy this summer with: delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon, trout in local lakes, and party boat trips for salmon, kokanee, sturgeon, and crab and rock fish. We are open to all kinds of fishing and are eager to try different forms of fishing and new locations are always well received. Come and wet a line with us.
