On November 4th, the duplicate group met at the Bridge Center, with 16 men playing (4 tables). Top winner today was the team of Art Donaldson / Milt Greenstein with 58.33 % (49.00 points out of a possible 84). In second place was Jim Nachtweih / Conrad Robertson (57.14 %), followed by Bob Daily / Bob Kahl (55.36 %) and Dan Greenberg/ Barry Rauchle (54.17 %).

On November 13th, 21 men gathered for lunch at Round Hill C.C. Top scorer today was Art Donaldson with 5,950 points, followed by Fred Massaro (5,180), Tony Rohrs (3,820), Milt Greenstein (3,660), and Ron Wahlberg (3,570). We had 1 small slam today, made by the teams of Art Donaldson / Fred Massaro (on the last hand of the day). Today was the lowest scoring day since continuous records have been kept, (the last 10 years), with an average round of only 496 points, compared to our year's average of 594 points. This beat out the previous low of 511 on October 9th of this year.

The lunch / bridge group met again on November 27th at Diablo C.C. with 23 men in attendance. After an excellent salmon lunch, we sat down to 3 hrs of so-so bridge. Marv DeHeus was our top achiever with a score of 4,890 points, (the lowest "top" score ever recorded), Jack Butler was second with 4,720 points, Lou Sandor was third with 4,480 points, Bill Sullivan was fourth with 4,310 points and Bob Wolf and Jai Yee tied for fifth with 4,130 points. We had 3 small slams made by the teams of Milt Greenstein / Alvin Buchignani, Oscar Krikorian / Lee Travis and Lytton DeSilva / Dimitris Argyriou. It is worth noting that none of the small slam people were in the money today.






