Luncheon Speaker By Little Sir Art Vogl

Speaker: Mary Chapman

Subject: An Elderly Wish Foundation

Mary Chapman retired from the Development Office at Carondelet High School twelve years ago. She was asked by the founder of An Elderly Wish Foundation (AEWF) to help organize this non-profit mission and here she is still organizing.
