They caught some Kokanee and Rainbow trout. Harry and Craig caught Kokanee to 17 inches. This is a great tasting fish. Bill Landers took Jack Waddell and Paul Dubow out in the delta for black bass, and they caught a lot of them to 3 lbs. Bill also spent a weekend at Collins Lake catching several dozen bass each day.

We will be very busy this summer with: delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon, trout in local lakes, party boat trips for SALMON, kokanee, sturgeon, crab, rock fish and of course our annual Back Yard Bar-B-Que. [Badge # 0126]

Bob Wolf / Dimitris Argyriou came in 2nd, followed by Jim Nachtweih / Marv DeHeus and Bill Sullivan / Rudy Gebert. All 4 teams earned ACBL black master points.

Lunch & Bridge

On May 8th, 25 SIR met at Round Hill C.C. for lunch and bridge. After a tasty beef stroganoff lunch, we sat down to an afternoon of low scoring bridge. Top scorer for this session was Dimitris Argyriou with 5,600 points. Next came Lee Travis (4,930), Gene Gould (4,640), Rudy Gebert (4,340), Bob Wolf (4,240) and Lytton DeSilva (4,130). Two small slams were made today by the teams of Marv DeHeus / Lee Travis and Rudy Gebert / Dennis Perry.

On May 22nd, 20 SIR gathered at Diablo C.C. for lunch and bridge. Today was another low scoring day of bridge, even worse than May 8th. We had only one small slam made by Jerry and Dennis. Today's average score and average round were the lowest of the year todate, by over 10%.
