

A June Doubleheader: *The Next 100* Years By George Friedman and *Sutton* by J.R. Moehringer

The book group met twice on June to make up for the May meeting rescheduled from Memorial Day.

George Friedman has a number of predictions for the remainder of the 21st century in The Next 100 *Years.* He believes the conflict with the Islamic world will be resolved before the end of the second decade of this century and America's control of the seas, the air and later space will continue to make it the dominant power. He foresees a time when Russia will implode because of declining population and other issues, and Poland, Turkey and Japan will become major world players. He advances data and theory for all his predictions. Discussion of the book was among the most spirited in recent months, with opinion sharply divided: some loved the book and some loathed it although this division was concealed in an average score of 3.5 stars. Lytton DeSilva recommended this perhaps prescient work while Richard Black led the discussion on June 3 attended by Cord Hull, Al Reynolds, John Riordan, Joel White, Jack Butler, Paul Freitas, Jerry Christopherson, Garrett Girvan, Nick Bowles, Dick Kauffman, Art Donaldson and Ken Sandy.

J.R. Moehringer's *Sutton* is fiction based on the life of Willie Sutton, who seems to have robbed over 200 banks in his time while achieving somewhat the status of a folk hero. The group loved the guy, as described by Moehringer, perhaps because during the twenties and thirties, as in the present day, it's easy to love a guy who takes advantage of banks. John Riordan recommended the book and Richard Black led the discussion on June 24 which was also attended by Lytton DeSilva, Cord Hull, Al Reynolds, Jack Butler, Jerry Christopherson, Garrett Girvan, Nick Bowles, Dick Kauffman, Art Donaldson, Shel Lawrence, and Larry Heaton . The group awarded the book 4.4 stars.

The group will next meet on July 22 to discuss *The Future of Freedom* by Fareed Zakaria.
