Next meeting will be Thursday, August 28th, at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. Meeting starts at 8:30am but a lot of us get there early to have some breakfast and to talk about our latest fishing exploits. Come early and introduce yourself.

The year for salmon continues to be disappointing. Raleigh Davis did get a salmon from Bodega Bay, but he is the only one to eat fresh red meat from the ocean. Six of us chartered a boat from Bodega early on, and caught only rockfish, lots of rockfish and limits of ling cod, but no salmon. Tom Kostik continued his success with black bass and stripers in the delta. Dick Thomson, Harry Sherinian, and Terry Miller went to Alaska and brought back coolers full of salmon and halibut. Dick got the big fish, a 61 pound halibut. Carl Moyer ended the local trout season with two successful shore fishing trips to San Pablo Reservoir. George Vogt and Harry Sherinian joined Carl on the ocean for rock fish and ling cod. Brad Hatcher got 2 Mackinaw trout from Lake Tahoe. Rich Fiscina got some trout from Battle Lake, but trips to the bay were not very productive. Joe Miscione got both Kokanee and King salmon from New Melones reservoir, and two keeper stripers from Montezuma slough. Steve Paulick also got limits of Kokanee from New Melones. Don Mittlesteadt and Ernie Wong ended the shad season in great style.

We will be very busy this summer with: delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon; trout in mountain and local lakes; salmon and rockfish from the ocean; and halibut in the bay. We live in a fishermen's paradise.



On July 1st, the duplicate group met at the Diablo Valley Bridge Center with 16 men attending. The team of Bob Wolf / Ravi Bhalla were the top team with 52.50 points out of a possible 84, for 62.50 %, and earning 0.80 master points. In 2nd place were Joel White / Ron Wolberg with 60.71 %, followed by Dan Green / Marv DeHues at 56.94 %.

The lunch/bridge group met on July 8th with 23 players in attendance. This was a high scoring day! Our high scorer was Lytton DeSilva with 6,510 points, followed by Dennis Perry with 6,230, Bob Wolf at 5,320, Lou Sandor with 4,530 and Dimitris Argyriou with 4,480. (Actually, the roving dummy was second with 6,420.) We had five small slams today, made by Bob Wolf and the roving dummy, Ron Wolberg / Norm Schoenfeld, and three by Lou Sandor with Lytton DeSilva, Tony Rohrs and Hal Redsun. Overall, today was back to a good scoring day, with the average score for a round of 641 points (for 4 hands), compared to our normal average of a little over 600. This was our best scoring day of the year todate.

A group of only 19 men gathered at Diablo C.C. on July 22th for lunch and bridge. (We had schedule conflicts with golf and the poker group.) This was a low scoring day with a high score of 4,490 points made by Dimitris Argyriou. (The bridge gods got even for the last session!) Dennis Perry took second place with 4,440 points, Marv DeHeus took third place with 4,360, in fourth place was Jai Yee with 4,340 and Bob Kahl took fifth with 4,190 points. Only 300 points separated first and fifth place! That is about as close as it can get! We had no slams made today, for the third time this year.

Note: The <u>September book will be "Agent Zigzag"</u> by Ben Macintyre rather than the book previously discussed.


Division 4 Individual Golf Qualifier
