

Salmon fishing has been slow, but is starting to pick up. The ocean has been turgid, and the wind is angry everywhere. Tough fishing conditions. We have caught trout from the shore at San Pablo and Shadow Cliffs Reservoirs. Guests were met at the door with a Kenwood 2012 Sauvignon Blanc Reserve. We sampled a Kenwood, Sonoma 2009 Zin, followed by Walnut Creek's only winery, ShadowBrook's 2007 and 08 Zinfandel, a real treat. We then poured a 2009 Primitivo (the Italian grape which is the "father" of Zinfandel) from Deaver Vineyards in Amador County. Amador, and especially the Shenandoah Valley, is known for its "Old Vine" Zins; some of the vines dating back to the 1860's are still in production. The finale was a hearty Deaver 2009 late harvest Zinfandel which had been picked at 35 brix and fermented to 16.6% alcohol. It was full, sweet, and we decided that it would be a great after dinner wine.

Another guided walking tour is scheduled for Saturday, **August 23, 2014**. This tour will explore the transformation of the **Mission Bay area** which includes the largest construction project in San Francisco since the 1906 earthquake. This tour should provide a unique perspective on the transformation from a backwater area of the bay to a modern biotech center. The tour will be conducted by a docent form the San Francisco Public Library at a cost of \$10 per person.

The tour will commence at 10:00 am from the plaza across from the Caltrain station at 4th and King Streets. It will take place over flat ground and last approximately 1 1/2 to 2 hours. There will be a sign up sheet at the July 21st SIRS luncheon meeting at which time more tour specifics will be provided.

On June 3rd, the duplicate group met at the Diablo Valley Bridge Center with 18 men attending. The team of Barry Rauchle / Ernie Scherne were the top team with 45.00 points out of a possible 72, for 62.50 %, and earning 0.90 master points. In 2nd place were Jack Butler / Dan Greenberg with 60.42 %, followed by Art Donaldson / Dimitris Argyriou at 57.64 %, and a tie for 4th place between Bob Wolf / Conrad Robertson and Milt Greenstein / Ron Wolberg at 50.00 %.

The lunch/bridge group met on June 10th with 28 players. Our high scorer was Bob Kahl with 5,680 points (helped with a last hand small slam with Jim Amland, the only slam of the day), followed by Norm Schoenfeld with 4,730, Bruce Ressen at 4,500, Oscar Krikorian at 4,370 and Dennis Perry with 4,240. A low scoring day today, with the average score for a round of 531 points (for 4 hands), compared to our normal average of a little over 600, our lowest scoring day of the year todate.

A group of 20 men gathered at Diablo C.C. on June 24th for a great lunch of sirloin tips, but the bridge did not match the lunch.

Another really low scoring day, the lowest of the year to date, even lower than our last session, had Jai Yee as high man with 5,080 points, Ron Wolberg with 4,560 and Bud Grisonti at 4,060. In fourth place was Bob Wolf at 4,090 followed by Alvin Buchignani with 4,060. Two small slams were made today by Paul Harris / Ron Wolberg and by Bob Wolf / Alvin Buchignani. The average round today was only 515 points for 4 hands.


