On April 1st, the duplicate group met at the Diablo Valley Bridge Center with 16 men attending. The team of Bob Kahl / Ron Wolberg were the top team with 45.32 points out of a possible 72, for 62.94 %, and earning 0.64 master points. In 2nd place were Jack Butler / Fred Cochran with 53.92 %, followed by Bob Wolf / Ernie Scherne at 53.00 %.

The lunch/bridge group met on May 13th with 20 players in attendance. Our high scorer was Rudy Gebert with 6,090 points, followed by Marv De-Hues with 4,700, Jai Yee at 4,670, Dennis Snarr at 4,550 and Bob Kahl with 4,530. We had only three small slams today, made by Rudy Gebert / Charley Schmidt, Bob Wolf / Bob Kahl and Rudy Gebert (again) / Dennis Snarr. Overall, today was back to an average scoring day, with the average score for a round of 603 points (for 4 hands), compared to our normal average of a little over 600.

A group of 22 men gathered at Round Hill C.C. on May 27th for lunch and bridge. After an excellent pot roast with mashed potatoes, green beans and cherry cheese cake lunch, we settled back for some serious bridge, but the cards wouldn't cooperate. Our high scorer was Dennis Perry with just an average score of 5,430 points. His competition just wasn't as good, with Jim Nachtweih coming in second at 4,970,followed by Bob Wolf (4,890), Bud Grisanti (4,880) and Jerry Christopherson (4,700). For only the second time this year, we had no slams made! Notice how close the last four are, only 270 points separating second and fifth place.
