2014 Christmas Dinner Dance Review






"American Nations" by Colin Woodard

Woodard posits there are in fact eleven rival regional cultures in North America. They were established with the initial European immigrations in the 16th and 17th centuries and they persist in meaningful ways in the present day. The group was impressed by the historical detail and perspective Woodard brought to his topic and acknowledged that the book gave a new lens through which to judge the American experience. However the logical contortions he went through to give perspective to present day events, let alone his predictions for the future, were more than most members of the group could accept. Lytton DeSilva recommended the book and Richard Black led the discussion. The lunch/bridge group met on December 13th with 23 players in attendance. Our high scorer was Ron Wolberg with 6,580 points, followed by Walt Kawecki at 6,330, Jai Yee with 6,090, Jack Butler with 5,/850 and Bob Kahl at 4,880. Three small slams were made by Jai Yee / Lytton DeSilva, Walt Kawecki with Jai Yee and Walt Kawecki / Bob Kahl. We finally broke out of our low scoring doldrums and had a very good average score of 3,861 points, well above recent averages. Actually our roving dummy (since we only had 23 players) was 2nd with 6,510 points, only 70 points behind the leader!

Due to Christmas being so close to our next session on Dec.23, and the small number of people available to play, the group decided to cancel the Dec. 23 session this year. Our group will next meet on January 13th at Round Hill Country Club. Also, the group decided to hold all of our sessions at Round Hill C. C. in 2015.


