# Luncheon Speaker By Little Sir Jim Barstow (jbarstow@aol.com)

Bernat Rosner was born in 1932 in rural Hungary. Overwhelmed by the Holocaust at the age of twelve, he was the only member of his family to survive the gas chambers of Auschwitz and the other horrors of the Nazi concentration camps. Bernie came to the United States in 1948 at the age of sixteen, and received his education at Cornell University and Harvard Law School. He spent his thirty-five years career in the legal department of the Safeway food chain, the last ten as the Company's chief legal officer. After his retirement in 1994, he and his friend Fritz Tubach co-wrote a book, An Uncommon Friendship, which tells the unique story of two youths trapped on opposite sides of the Holocaust.
