

The big excursion of the early fall was a trip to Pyramid Lake in Nevada led by Ernie Wong and Karl Droese. Twelve of our adventurous anglers fished in two groups: Karl's group fished with a guide from a boat, and Ernie's group fished from the shore with ladders using either spinning or fly gear. The fishermen were Karl Droese, Joe Karg, Rich Fiscina, Chuck Cornell, Larry Gray, Jeff Gray (Larry's son), Steve Paulick, Ben LaSala, Ken Konzak, Ernie Wong, Pete Gates, Pedro Contreras, and Paul Dubow. At the other end of the State, Carl Moyer chartered a salmon boat out the gate and Paul Dubow, Brad Hatcher, Rich Fiscina, Karl Droese, and Richard Bal caught limits of bright and delicious salmon. Carl was less successful on 2 sturgeon outings, catching and releasing only small fish. Harry Sherinian was surpised when he caught a 14 lb salmon fishing for stripers with Tom Kostik in the Delta. Both Tom and Harry caught keeper sized stripers also. Mike Corker also enjoyed the plugging for stripers, getting more keepers as the fall run begins. Carl Moyer continued to catch rock and ling cod from the ocean. Alas, the catfish boom from San Pablo Reservoir ended, and none were caught on Carl's last two attempts.
