Raliegh Davis went after crab on a party boat from Emeryville and brought home ten big ones. Mike Corker and Tom Kostik fished for black and striped bass catching a few. Ernie Wong just got back from a few days fishing up at Pyramid Lake in Nevada. This is a somewhat unique type of fishing as the fisherman stands on a ladder in the water and casts out to the fish.
