We plan to meet on the second Wednesday of each month. The location of the meeting will be determined by the number of players we have.





**Guest Speaker for March 21, 2016 meeting.** Name: **Bill Green** Topic: **Vietnam War and The Wall** 

Bill was drafter into the Army in August 1967, volunteered for the infantry and landed in Vietnam in January 1968. His unit was the 198th Light Infantry Brigade. Six months into his tour he rose to the rank of Sergeant and squad leader. During his tour he was wounded twice, receiving two Purple Hearts and two Bronze Stars. He returned to the states in August 1969 where he began an apprenticeship with the IBEW and worked as an electrician until his retirement in 2002. He and his wife Peggy, and family, have lived in Alamo since 1977. Bill is the co-director of the Speakers Bureau of the Vietnam Veterans of Diablo Valley, which has spoken to over 65,000 students in the past thirteen years. Bill has served on the Board of Directors for the VNVDV for the past decade and is currently the president. He is also a mentor at the Concord Vet Center for returning troops. Bills presentation will touch on his tour in Vietnam and The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, a running history of the people on the wall, such as age groups, youngest to the oldest, where they were from, how many were related, etc ....
