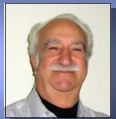

We frequently visited a nice table full of "accompanying Bites"

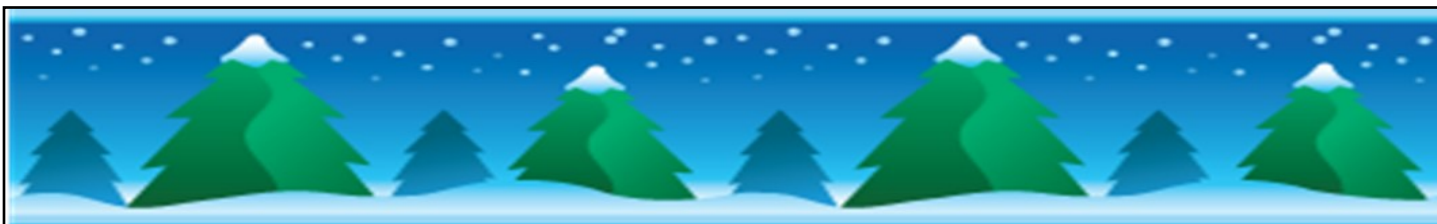

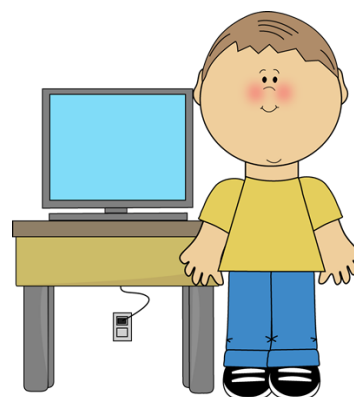
