Meeting Speaker 2018 Little SIR Jerry Hicks (jerryhicks@astound.net)



Our November luncheon includes a salute to our veterans who have served our country so honorably. One hundred years ago, the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month the armistice was signed, ending WWI, the "war to end all

wars"! We are so happy to have **Colonel Chris Starling** join us on this special day.

The son of a retired Navy captain, Chris Starling graduated with a BA from the Virginia Military Institute and was commissioned as an infantry officer in 1988. He has served in the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Marine Divisions and participated in Operations Desert Shield, Desert Storm, and Iraqi Freedom.

While on active duty, Colonel Starling commanded the 2d Battalion, 2d Marines in Camp Lejeune, NC and the 23d Marines in San Bruno, CA. Chris completed his fifth deployment to the Persian Gulf area in July 2007 as the Commanding Officer of the Battalion Landing Team. His staff assignments included Assistant Professor of Military Science at the US Military Academy, West Point; Chief of the Partnership Division at US Africa Command in Stuttgart, Germany; and the senior US Military Advisor to the Emirati Presidential Guard in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.

Colonel Starling retired from the Marine Corps in 2014. In 26 years serving as an infantry officer, he made ten overseas deployments including three combat tours. Upon retirement, he became the Director of Military and Veteran Affairs at the Marines' Memorial Association in San Francisco, CA. In 2017 he began his current role as Operations Director at VetsInTech, a nonprofit organization supporting veterans with programs for employment, education, and entrepreneurship in the tech industry.

Chris still found time to earn a Master's degree in Public Administration from the City University of New York. Additionally, he has represented the Marine Corps as a revered Hoover Fellow at Stanford University where he wrote about China's expanding influence in Africa.
