Book Group 2 met on Thursday, November 21, to discuss "The Bonanza King" by Gregory Crouch. This book told the story of John Mackay (pronounced "Mackie") and "the battle over the greatest riches in the American west". The time period covered California and Nevada during the 1849 Gold Rush. John Mackay, through hard work and perseverance, rose from a child in a poor, fatherless Irish family in the slums of New York to become one of the richest men in America. In addition to all aspects involved in mining for gold and silver in Nevada's Comstock Lode ("the Big Bonanza"), the book goes into great detail about those times, which included early San Francisco, the Pony Express, the transcontinental railroad, cable cars, Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain), business monopolies, funding the Civil War, and more.

The group rated The Bonanza King from 3 to 4.1, averaging a good 3.8. Everyone liked the story and the California history told in the book. As a whole, the group questioned the author's style in providing details which were of less importance to the story itself and not providing more information about the individual characters.

Michael Barrington recommended the book, while the discussion included Fred Wachowicz, Fred Schafer, Jerry Hicks, and Alan Pope.

The group will meet next on Thursday, January 23, at 11am at the Ygnacio Valley Library, located at 2661 Oak Grove Rd. in Walnut Creek.

There will be no December meeting. The group will discuss "Between the World and Me" by Ta-Nehisi Coates. We have room for more book club members, so If you are interested in reading good books, we hope to see you there.
