New Golf Handicap System

Starting January 1, 2020, USGA (& NCGA) will be adopting a new handicap system. One of the big changes will be the maximum hole scoring.

• The maximum hole score for each player will be limited to a **Net Double Bogey**. The calculation is simple: Par +2 + any strokes you receive for the hole based on your course handicap. Example: A Course Handicap of 18 receives one stoke per hole for 18 holes; the player's max score is triple bogey on any hole, which equals a **Net Double Bogey**.

Other changes include:

- Handicap will be based off your 8 best scores out of the past 20. (It was based on your best 10). Maximum handicap that can be issued will increase to 54 (It was 36).
- Slope Rating and now Course Rating and Par will be used to determine your Course Handicap, allowing you to play from different sets of tees without any adjustment.
- Daily handicap revisions, taking account of the course and weather conditions calculation.

Our SIR Golf Leadership team will try to figure out how we will implement this new handicap system.
