Book Club 2 met on Thursday, March 26 via Zoom videoconference, to discuss "Say Nothing" by Patrick Radden Keefe.

Say Nothing, a nonfiction book, reads as a part history, part crime novel about the Irish Republican Army ("IRA") from the early 1970's and leading up to the 1998 signing of the Good Friday Agreement between the governments of the United Kingdom, Northern Ireland, and the Government (Republic) of Ireland. After the Good Friday Agreement, Boston College created an archive of transcripts of interviews with some IRA participants involved in the conflict. The author used those transcripts to write Say Nothing.

Overall, the group rated "Say Nothing" a 3.8 out of 5; with a range of 2.8 to 4.5. Most members learned a lot about the IRA during the violent period from the 1960's to the late 1990s. Special thanks to Michael Barrington for his first-hand accounts of his experience living outside of Belfast in the early 1970s and his knowledge of the IRA's conflict with the British.

The next Book Club 2 meeting will be on **Thursday**, **April 30**, at 11 am either by Zoom videoconference. The group will discuss "The Splendid and the Vile" by Erik Larson. This is a nonfiction account of Winston Churchill's first year as prime minister during the German Blitz, May 10, 1940 to May 10, 1941. We have room for more book club

Staying Connected During Trying Times

Venmo – Quick Pay Money Transfer Option that is FREE

The Branch has a Venmo Account tied to our checking account for member transfers.

What can you do with Venmo?

You can make payments directly to the Treasurer for Branch Activities such as Lunch, Annual Dues, Parties, and maybe Dine-O-Sirs without writing a check. The Treasurer gets notified of payment and pulls the money into the checking account and notifies the Activity Chair of your payment.

Advantages:

- Avoid the pay line at Lunches
- Avoid having checks outstanding for long periods of time (makes book keeper happy)
- Payment not made until a few days before event cut-off date.

How to use Venmo:

- Member down loads Venmo application for their phone from the App Store.
- Create an account following instructions on the App that will link your Bank Account to Venmo.
- Initiate payment by selecting the Branch Account by searching on "first name" or "User ID". Enter the amount of payment and identify the purpose of the payment, i.e., Lunch (current month) payment.
- Payments need to be made prior to any cutoff dates for the activities and the Thursdays prior to the monthly Luncheon. This gives the system and Treasurer time to process payments and the Treasurer time to notify activity chair of payment.

Rules of Attendance & Membership for SIR Branch 116

RULE 100. A member shall be notified in writing and/or telephone by his Branch of the pending termination of his membership should he be responsible for any of the following:

- Miss three (3) consecutive regular luncheon meetings without having been excused by contacting the designated Branch Attendance person prior to the meeting date.
- Did not attend one-half of the regular luncheon meetings within the previous twelve consecutive month period. NOTE: Excused meetings cannot be included to achieve the minimum attendance.
- All legitimate alternatives to termination shall be explored. The member's response may suggest an alternative to termination such as inactive status.

RULE 101. Certification of attendance by a member at another Branch meeting will be considered as a credit to his attendance record. Individual Branches may limit the number of make-ups during a 12-month period.

Non Responsibility Declaration

RULE 345: All activities arranged for or by, Sons In Retirement, Incorporated, and its Branches, are for the convenience and pleasure of the members and their guests who desire to participate. Sons In Retirement, Incorporated, and its Branches do not assume any responsibility for the well being or safety of the participants or their property, in any matters pertaining to said activities.

Checks for Trips

Trips of 2 days and 1 night or less may be made payable to the Branch conducting the trip. Trips in excess of 1 night must be made payable to the travel agency involved.
