




Computer & Technology Neil Schmidt (SIR.Area2.CAT@gmail.com)


Get your name into Mike Ward to be included in this new approach to travel planning. Let's take advantage of the dead time now to be ready for travel opportunities when covid retires from the picture.

A principal character of novel is the bridge itself begun by a janissary Pasha of the Ottoman Empire in 1516 over the Drina river which forms the border between Serbia and Bosnia. Subsidiary characters-Moslem, Christian and Jew—all have their stories to tell over the next four hundred years until the outbreak of The Great War. Book group members commented on the elegant style of the writing and the universal wisdom in the tales presented. Book group members frequently consulted the web to understand the background of the conflicts in the novel, the Balkan wars in the 1990's and the enduring conflicts in that region today. Alas, there are reverberations in our own experiences of 2020. Although this book was not always an easy read, most members found the experience of reading it

and the subsequent discussion, rewarding while awarding the book 3.6 stars.

Book Group 2 met by teleconference on Thursday, November 19, to discuss "The Nickel Boys", by Colson Whitehead. The central character, Elwood Curtis, who tried to do the right thing in life by following the teachings of Martin Luther King, is imprisoned on false allegations of being an accomplice to car theft. While serving his sentence at the "Nickel Academy", a reform school for boys, he finds out the hard truth about the world he lived in. The author told a fictional story, based on reallife events that occurred at The Dozier School for Boys located in Marianna, Florida. Even though the story was hard to read because of the subject matter, the group gave the book an overall good rating of 4.6 out of 5.

The next Book Club 2 meeting will be on Thursday, **December 17**, at 11 am by videoconference using the Zoom app. The group will discuss, "Buried in the Sky" the "extraordinary story of the Sherpa climbers on K2's deadliest day", by Peter Zuckerman and Amanda Padoan. We are also considering the following novels for future discussion: "The Paris Architect" by Charles Belfoure; "Manhunt" (The 12-day Chase to catch Lincoln's Killer) by James Swanson; and "City of Thieves" by David Benioff. We welcome anyone who is interested to join us on December 17.

When individuals log into the December 21st Zoom meeting, they will have an opportunity to select and move into one of the breakout rooms. If they desire, they can later move to another open room or return to the main Zoom window.

The Zoom Breakout Room feature was tested at the at the end of our November 16th Luncheon Meeting and it was a lot of fun.

How do I select a specific breakout room?

 If you are using a PC or Mac computer, it is helpful to have the latest version of Zoom on your computer. You can do this by selecting the following link prior to the Dec. 21 meeting: <u>https://zoom.us/download</u> and then "Download" to update your software.

When you join the Dec. 21 meeting, select the "Breakout Rooms: icon at the bottom your screen and choose your desired room.

• If you are using a smartphone or tablet, select the "Join Breakout Room" icon of the left side of your screen and choose your desired room. (No version update is needed for these devices.)

More Questions & Answers About Our Breakout Room Meeting

Q: How often will these Zoom Breakout Meetings be held, i.e., monthly to replace the Virtual Luncheons, only this first time since it is the holiday season, or periodically:

Answer: Regular luncheon speaker meetings are still planned and the BEC has not decided on how to deal with breakout sessions in the future. Success or failure of the December Breakout Only Meeting will undoubtedly influence BEC's decision. Individuals may want to attend a BEC meeting to provide their input.

Q: How long will the meetings last:

Answer: They can run as long as people are interested and still attending a session. Virtual chat sessions generally run out of steam after 60 minutes or so.

Q: Is there a suggested structure for the meeting?

Answer: The sessions will be freeform without necessarily a predefined structure but the leader may want to start off with a few leading questions to get the discussion going.

Q: Will members have a call-in option if they are not familiar with Zoom?

Answer: Members will be able to dial in via a regular phone. When they join the main Zoom session, they will need to tell the Host which group they want to be in and they can be manually moved. They will not have the ability to move around freely between groups though. They are essentially stuck in the initially assigned group unless they hang-up, rejoin the general meeting and get manually reassigned to another group.

Q: When will members get the December 21st Breakout Room Zoom web link?

Answer: Zoom web links are emailed to all members 3 or 4 days prior to each Zoom meeting. A reminder email is also sent out early on the meeting day.

Rules of Attendance & Membership for SIR Branch 116

RULE 100. A member shall be notified in writing and/or telephone by his Branch of the pending termination of his membership should he be responsible for any of the following:

- Miss three (3) consecutive regular luncheon meetings without having been excused by contacting the designated Branch Attendance person prior to the meeting date.
- Did not attend one-half of the regular luncheon meetings within the previous twelve consecutive month period. NOTE: Excused meetings cannot be included to achieve the minimum attendance.
- All legitimate alternatives to termination shall be explored. The member's response may suggest an alternative to termination such as inactive status.

RULE 101. Certification of attendance by a member at another Branch meeting will be considered as a credit to his attendance record. Individual Branches may limit the number of make-ups during a 12-month period.

RULE 345: All activities arranged for or by, Sons In Retirement, Incorporated, and its Branches, are for the convenience and pleasure of the members and their guests who desire to participate. Checks for Trips
