We have two speakers from the Contra Costa County Historical Society (CCCHS) for our January 2020 Luncheon.

They will present a brief tour of the county's history, from the first Spanish and Mexican settlers, to statehood and on up to the present. The talk will touch on the county's government, economy, growth and development over its 169 years, as well as a brief description of the Historical Society and its rich collection of archives.

John Greitzer is the President of the CCCHS Board of Directors. He retired in 2013 after first as a newspaper reporter and then a thirty-year career in transportation planning and water policy for local and regional agencies in northern California. His work for Contra Costa County ranged from pedestrian safety and traffic improvements, to advocating for federal funds to improve the John F. Baldwin Ship Channel along the County's northern coast. John plays guitar and bass in his spare time.

Scott Saftler is a member of the CCCHS Board of Directors. Scot worked for Bank of America for 26 years as an employee and a consultant. He moved from New York to San Francisco just in time for the Loma Prieta Earthquake in 1989. In his spare time Scott says he is chasing down living and dead relatives on the family tree which currently spans about seven generations and some 1,800 people.
