

On Monday September 21, 2020, we will have a "virtual lunch" meeting via Zoom. Gregory Crouch will be our luncheon speaker. Gregory is an author who specializes in adventurous and historic subjects. Most recently, he is the author of <u>The Bo-</u> <u>nanza King: John Mackay and the Battle Over the</u> <u>Greatest Riches in the American West</u> (Scribner, 2018).

Crouch is also the author of the true-life World War II flying adventure <u>*China's Wings*</u> (Bantam, 2012) and the mountaineering memoir <u>*Enduring*</u> <u>*Patagonia*</u> (Random House, 2001).

A regular book critic, Crouch has reviewed more than 30 books for the *Wall Street Journal*, the *Washington Post*, the *New York Times Book Review*, and NPR Books, among others. He is a member of the National Book Critics Circle.

In 1988, Gregory Crouch graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York, where he studied military history. He completed U.S. Army Airborne and Ranger schools and led two infantry platoons. He left the Army to pursue other interests, most notably in rock and ice climbing and high-stakes international mountaineering. He developed a particular obsession with the storm-swept peaks of Patagonia and made seven expeditions to those remote mountains, where he made a number of world-class first ascents.


Along the way, he became a writer. Crouch's entire career has been built from following his intellectual and adventurous interests to their absolute conclusions.

Book Group 2 met by teleconference on Thursday, August 20, to discuss "Empires of the Sky" by Alexander Rose. The group had a good discussion about this true story of airships (zeppelins), airplanes and the competition to rule the skies. The book begins with balloons and traces the rise of airships, primarily developed Count Ferdinand von Zeppelin, and later, the rise of airplanes, first by the Wright brothers, and later by Juan Trippe, who developed airplane travel around the world with a new airlines company, Pan American Airlines. It is a "sweeping narrative" ending with the explosion of the Hindenburg on May 6, 1937. While the group believed that the story could have been told in a shorter version, the group gave "Empires of the Sky" an overall rating of 3.5 out of 5.

The next Book Club 2 meeting will be on **Thursday**, **September 17**, at 11 am by videoconference using the Zoom app. The group will discuss, "A Gentleman in Moscow" by Amor Towles. After "A Gentleman in Moscow", Book Club 2 will discuss "An Army at Dawn", by Rick Atkinson, which is about the war in North Africa in 1942 and 1943.



Rules of Attendance & Membership for SIR Branch 116

RULE 100. A member shall be notified in writing and/or telephone by his Branch of the pending termination of his membership should he be responsible for any of the following:

- Miss three (3) consecutive regular luncheon meetings without having been excused by contacting the designated Branch Attendance person prior to the meeting date.
- Did not attend one-half of the regular luncheon meetings within the previous twelve consecutive month period. NOTE: Excused meetings cannot be included to achieve the minimum attendance.
- All legitimate alternatives to termination shall be explored. The member's response may suggest an alternative to termination such as inactive status.

RULE 101. Certification of attendance by a member at another Branch meeting will be considered as a credit to his attendance record. Individual Branches may limit the number of make-ups during a 12-month period.

Non Responsibility Declaration

RULE 345: All activities arranged for or by, Sons In Retirement, Incorporated, and its Branches, are for the convenience and pleasure of the members and their guests who desire to participate. Sons In Retirement, Incorporated, and its Branches do not assume any responsibility for the well being or safety of the participants or their property, in any matters pertaining to said activities.

Checks for Trips

Trips of 2 days and 1 night or less may be made payable to the Branch conducting the trip. Trips in excess of 1 night must be made payable to the travel agency involved.
