Speaker: Matt Wachowicz—"Professional yacht racing sailor"



Matt Wachowicz

Matt Wachowicz is a tactical navigator who has raced professionally since 1998. He has 3 America's Cup campaigns to his credit, and has played both a technical and sailing role on 2 Volvo Ocean Race teams, as well as on a host of other international grand prix racing programs. He currently races in the IMA Maxi, Mini-Maxi, ORC, IRC and Superyacht circuits worldwide. While his focus over the last few years has been more on the inshore aspect of the sport, Matt originally learned the art of blue water navigation under the tutelage of the legendary Mark Rudiger, and lately has returned to his ocean racing roots with a renewed focus on offshore racing. Having achieved an Overall Win in the Transpac in 2013, as well as an additional Class Win in 2015 in the Sled Division, he also assisted the VO70 II Mostro in setting the World Sailing Record on the Chicago-Macinac course, as well as setting course records on the Long Course in the Bayview Mac Race and the Trans-Superior Race. He currently lives in Nashville, TN with his family, and is proud to be a part of the international sailing community.

Book Group #1 last met on July 26 to discuss an account of the great migration --1915-1970-- of African Americans from the American south to the north and west entitled "The Warmth of Other Suns" by Isabel Wilkerson. John Kopchik recommended the

book while Richard Black led the discussion with Mike Schneider, Jerry Christopherson, John Riordan, Joel White, Art Donaldson, Garrett Girvan, Mac McLoughlan, and Richard Rossland. Members found the book at once a compelling read about the personal stories of those involved while at the same time a jarring eye-opener about the conditions in the south which compelled 6,000,000 African-Americans to take the rails and roads to the north and west. This book is at once an easy read with compelling relevance for today and thus the group gave it the highest rating of any book in the last year: 4.6 stars.



Book Group 2 Allan Pope

Book Group 2 met by teleconference on Thursday, July 15, to discuss "Barbarian Days-A Surfing Life" by William Finnegan. This book is a memoir which covers the author's surfing life from when he was growing up in California and Hawaii during his teen years to surfing locations halfway around the world, in Fiji, Australia, and South Africa in his twenties. Along the way, the reader meets an assortment of his surfing buddies who become part of the author's surfing pilgrimage. In his search for the perfect wave, the author describes what seems to be every wave he has ever ridden.

The writing style is very good, the metaphors prolific. The book is long and for the most part describes an interesting sport that can be an obsession in one's life, which is certainly the case for the author. The character development seems secondary

to the places where the surf is good and the native people friendly.

This memoir received mixed reviews from Book Club 2 members. The primary critique was that the book was long and did not need to describe every wave encountered by the author. For these reasons Book Club members gave this book a rating of 3.8 out of 5.

The next Book Club 2 meeting will be on **Thursday**, **August 19**, at 11 am by videoconference using the Zoom app. The group will discuss, "Mud and Stars" by Sara Wheeler. In the months ahead, Book Club 2 members have discussed reading "Project Hail Mary" by Andy Weir. Whether you have read a book or not, we welcome anyone interested to join us.

he SIR Area 16 Computer & Technology Group will be having a Zoom meeting on Thursday, **August 19th at 9:30 AM**. (The Zoom doors will open at 9:15 AM so come a little early to chat with friends).

The August presentation topic will be Windows 11 by CAT Director Frank May. His presentation will discuss the current functionality and status of Windows 10 and the move by Microsoft to Windows 11. Why is Microsoft moving away from providing updates to Windows 10 to requiring Windows 11 and what does that mean to individual users of Windows? Much of the new functionality revolves

around the need to beef up security. What is being added and why is it important? What additional functionality and features can we expect? At this po0int it looks like many recent machines may not run Windows 11 because of processor requirements. Will try to give the latest on what are the basic requirements for the new OS.
