Message from Sam



Happy New Year and welcome to 2021.

January 2021 Luncheon Speaker

Climbing Everest

ED WEBSTER (age 64), born in 1956 in Boston, grew up in Lexington, Massachusetts and obtained a bachelor's degree in anthropology from Colorado College in 1978. Married, with an 18-year old daughter, he lives in Harpswell, Maine. A veteran of seven Himalayan expeditions, Ed is one of America's best-known rock climbers and Himalayan mountaineers. He has achieved several worldfamous climbs, most notably his first ascent of a new route up Mt. Everest's remote, highlydangerous Kangshung East Face in Tibet as part of an international 4-man team in 1988. Ed's expedition climbed Everest without oxygen bottles, radios, or even any Sherpa assistance, an ascent hailed as among the most audacious mountaineering feats of all time.

Ed's writing and photographs have, additionally, been published worldwide in over fifty magazine articles, in Alpinist, Climbing Magazine, Rock & Ice Magazine, Popular Mechanics, Rolling Stone, and the New York Times Sunday Magazine, among others. His five books include all three editions of his definitive guidebook, Rock Climbs in the White Mountains of New Hampshire; Climbing in the Magic Islands to the Lofoten Islands of Arctic Norway; and his best-selling autobiography (5 Stars on Amazon) titled, Snow in the Kingdom, My Storm Years on Everest.

However his real claim to fame is that he is one of just three mountaineers cited in the board game, Trivial Pursuit. The other two are Mt. Everest's first ascentionists, Sir Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay.

Rules of Attendance & Membership for SIR Branch 116

RULE 100. A member shall be notified in writing and/or telephone by his Branch of the pending termination of his membership should he be responsible for any of the following:

RULE 101. Certification of attendance by a member at another Branch meeting will be considered as a credit to his attendance record. Individual Branches may limit the number of make-ups during a 12-month period.
