

On Saturday, **July 23**, the Walking Tours group will enjoy a guided walking tour of the Walnut Creek downtown business area. The tour is hosted by the Walnut Creek Historical Society. This year we will go back to Reno for golf. The dates will be **Tuesday Sept. 6 to Friday Sept. 9**.


We plan to play Toiyabe Golf Club and Wolf Run Golf Club.
