MEEK MANSION - MARCH 26

On MARCH 26, 2022, the Saturday Walking Tours Activity will visit the Meek Mansion historical site in Hayward. The tour will be conducted by Caroline Sandoval, Outreach and Educational Manager, Hayward Area Historical Society. The Mansion was built in 1869 by William Meek, one of the first pioneers of commercial agriculture in Alameda County. When he built the mansion he had planted over 3000 acres of cherry, apricot, plum, and almond orchards at that site.

Ms. Sandoval is an excellent and very qualified speaker, and we anticipate that everyone will greatly enjoy her presentation. The tour will begin at 10:15 at the Mansion's front steps. Please anticipate her tour will run 60+ minutes. There is a \$150

donation which will be shared equally by participants. We plan to limit the event to 20 participants and the cost should be \$7.50 per person.

This is a Hayward City Recreational Park and it has full bath room facilities.

The Mansion has wheelchair access for the FIRST FLOOR ONLY. We understand that the majority of the tour will be conducted on this floor.

We expect all participants to be fully Covid compliant as it is defined by the CCD for that date. Participants should be prepared to wear masks.

Book Club 2 met February 17 to discuss A Year in the Life of William Shakespeare: 1599, by James Shapiro. Nine members were in attendance. We rated the book 3.25 out of 4.

The book presents an intimate history of the most important and productive years in Shakespeare's life. How did Shakespeare go from being a talented poet and playwright to become one of the greatest writers who ever lived? In this one year the reader follows what he reads and writes, what he saw, and what he created, Henry V, Julias Caesar, As You Like It, and Hamlet.

Some members commented that some prior knowledge of these plays was useful in following the

story. Other members enjoyed reading of the momentous events in world history that occurred in 1599: a rebellion against Queen Elizabeth, turmoil in Ireland, and a threat by Spain to launch an invasion of England. The book "brings the news, intrigue and flavor of the times together with wonderful detail about how Shakespeare worked as an actor, businessman, and playwright, to create an exceptionally immediate and gripping account of an inspiring moment in history.



Rules of Attendance & Membership for SIR Branch 116
