Book Club 2 met April 21 to discuss There is Nothing for You Here: Finding Opportunity in the Twenty-First Century by Fiona Hill. With ten members in attendance we rated the book 2.6/4.

This book is a memoir of Ms. Hill's life growing up in the era of declining coal production in northern England. Her father, a coal miner, lost his job and he advised her, "there is nothing for you here". Despite the poor circumstances of her birth and childhood she managed to go further than her father could ever dream. She studied in Moscow and at Harvard, became an American citizen, and served three US Presidents as a Russian and Eastern European foreign policy expert.

The author's main message, that declining opportunity has set America on the grim path of modern Russia and draws on her personal journey out of poverty, as well as her unique perspectives as a historian and policy maker. This is a deeply personal account in which the author shares what she has learned, and why expanding opportunity is the only long-term hope for our democracy.

The next meeting of Book Club 2 will be on May 19, at 11 AM, at the Ygnacio Valley Library. We will be discuss Sooley, by John Grisham. Along with John Grisham fans the theme of this book, basketball, will be especially appealing to fans of the sport. Whether you have read the book or not all are welcome to attend.


