

Speaker for October Meeting


Author Steven Burchik and Photographs of "A Year in Vietnam"

Vietnam veteran, Steven Burchik, served as a sergeant in the role of a forward observer with a mortar platoon as part of the Army's 1st Infantry Division from June 68 to June 69. While deployed he brought his personal camera to record their daily

activities. He sent more than 4,000 photographs home to his wife.

The photos were stored in a closet until he was asked to share some of them with a high school English class. This led to many more requests and eventually he authored a book, "Compass and a Camera, A year in Vietnam", which won a Silver Medal at the INDEPENDENT PUBLISHER AWARDS in New York in 2015. His latest book, "Focus on Vietnam", was launched on Veterans Day 2016.

His talk will include a slide presentation of some of his most memorable photos.

Book Group #1 just met on Monday August 22 to discuss "The Last Green Valley" by Mark Sullivan. The book illuminates the remarkable struggle of a family thrust into the chaos and destruction encompassing the German military's retreat from Russian

armies advancing through Ukraine in 1944 as part of a surprising, little known, World War II event of horse drawn wagon trains heading west referred to as the Long Trek.

From March 1944 to March 1947 the family endures military attacks, separations and prisoner camps until after braving dangers and seizing opportunities they are ultimately reunified in West Germany. The story is all the more remarkable as the author follows this very real family's continued journey to the United States and finally to the Green Valley of the Gallatin Mountains surrounding Bozeman, Montana.

Mac McLoughlin recommended the book while Steve Bort led the discussion with Art Donaldson, Mike Schneider, Paul Freitas, Dick Kauffman and Garrett Girvan. The group was greatly impressed with the resiliency of the Martel family in surpassing unthinkable roadblocks and conditions and generally liked the author's weaving of the story. The book received a strong positive rating of 4.1 stars.



Book Club 2 met September 15 to discuss Red Sparrow by Jason Matthews.

This is a book in the grand spy tradition of John le Care. The author was a 33 year old veteran of the C.I.A. who "served in multiple overseas locations and engaged in clandestine collection of national security intelligence." Written with insider detail known only to a veteran CIA officer, the novel is packed with insider detail and brims with Matthew's life experience, including his knowledge of espionage, counterintelligence, surveillance trade-craft, spy recruitment, cyber-warfare, and covert communications.

The novel pits an ambitious, hotheaded rookie agent named Nash, against a gorgeous Russian intelligence officer named Dominika. The plot, swings convincingly between Moscow, Helsinki, Athens and Washington with Dominika, a very attractive

Soviet "sparrow" who is used to compromise a Western spy. Secret alliances are made and broken. As the novel unfolds Dominika and Nate's game reaches a deadly crossroads. Soon one of them begins a dangerous double existence in a life and death operation involving intelligence agencies from Moscow to Washington DC

We found the book well composed and very entertaining. The payoff is the ending of Red Sparrow. You will be surprised.

On a 5 point scale the members voted a 4.4 score.

Our next meeting will be on October 20 at 11 AM at Arbolado Park, Walnut Creek, near the basketball courts. We will be discussing The World Played Chess by Robert Dugoni. Whether you have read the book or not, all are invited to attend.




Bocce
